## MISCELLANEOUS LETTERS SENT BY THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE, 1796-1889

On the 228 rolls of this microfilm publication are reproduced the 264 letter books containing handwritten transcripts of outgoing "miscellaneous" communications of the General Land Office from 1812, the date of its establishment as a bureau in the Treasury Department, to 1889. Four letter books containing communications relating to the public lands sent by the Secretary and the Register of the Treasury from 1796 to 1812 precede these communications.

The first two volumes of the series, transcripts of communications sent by the Secretary of the Treasury from 1796 to May 1812, concern matters of general policy in the administration of the public lands. In the third volume and the greater part of the fourth, transcripts of communications sent by the Register of the Treasury from 1802 to 1812 concern the bookkeeping aspects of public lands disposal, chiefly the transmission of cash receipts and land patents. The latter part of the fourth volume (April-August 1812) contains transcripts of both types of communications but issuing from the General Land Office rather than from the separate offices of the Secretary and the Register of the Treasury. In 1849 the General Land Office was placed under the jurisdiction of the newly created Department of the Interior. This transfer produced no important change in the manner of keeping records, and no break in the letter book series. In 1946 the General Land Office was consolidated with the Grazing Service in the Department of the Interior' to form the Bureau of Land Manaccement.

The outgoing letters here reproduced are "miscellaneous" in contrast to certain categories of correspondence that were transcribed in special letter book series. Among the latter is the series of letters to Surveyors General, 1796-1901, filmed as Microcopy 27. In 1829, a separate series of conmunications to the Registers and Receivers of district land offices was begun; and after that date such communications no longer appear in the "miscellaneous" series, except in some of the last volumes.

Other series were established for communications concerning private land claims, Indian matters, military bounty land warrants, and the like.

The volumes are identified by two sets of numbers. There are 24 volumes numbered in order for the years 17961829. In November 1829 a new set of numbers was started. Volumes with these numbers, especially the first 24, are often designated as "new series." The volumes from November 1829 to July 1877 are numbered in order from 1 to 147 , except that the numbers $92,94,105,106,108,110$, and 111 are not used. Until July 1877, letters were generally transcribed in the chronological order in which they were dispatched, which was usually, but not necessarily the same as the chronological order of their writing. Occasionally there is some overlapping of the dates covered by volumes and consequently of the dates of the rolls of this microcopy.

From July 1877 through June 1886 two volumes were used at the same time. In one volume were copied letters to persons whose surnames or official titles begin with letters in the first part of the alphabet; the other volume was used for the last part of the alphabet. Except for the first two such volumes, the divisions were A-I and J-Z. During July and August 1886 three volumes were used. After August 10, 1386, the alphabetical divisions were not used.

Some of the later volumes of the series contain for the most part names and addresses of persons to whom identical or form letters were sent. The last two volumes contain chiefly letters relating to Soldiers Additional Homestead Entries. In these later volumes, 1886-89, there are some letters to Registers and Receivers and to other persons not usually found among the "miscellaneous letters." Within all the volumes the letters were copied in chronological order.

After the alphabetical divisions were started in July 1877, one number was assigned to two volumes. Many of
these volumes are differentiated by the suffixes " A " and "B." For clarity these suffixes have been used consistently, even when the volumes are not actually so marked. The corresponding " A " and " B " volumes do not cover the same time period. For information concerning the contents of individual volumes, see the table of contents.

Brief abstracts of the contents of some of the letters together with cross-references and the initials of the transcribing clerks appear in the margins.

On unnumbered preliminary pages in every volume except 198A there is an index of personal names or official titles of addresses, and in some of the later volumes also of names of persons mentioned in the letters.

The records reproduced in this microcopy are part of the records in the National Archives designated as Record Group 49, Records of the Bureau of Land Management.
