A Naturalization Examiners' role was to recommend or not recommend to the court a given applicant for naturalization. Initially, examiners entered a summary of action taken on each naturalization petition on U.S. Naturalization Service Form 2328 (or its equivalent), known as a "petition brief" or "admitted slip." The Examiners' role became larger in the late 1920s and post-1929 petition files are more substantial than those of the earlier period, often including correspondence, affidavits, transcripts of depositions, and other investigatory materials. Each INS District maintained its own petition files.

Data called for by the form: Petition number, court, date filed, date and place of prior declaration, name, residence, nationality, and business of petitioner, name, residence, and business of two witnesses, results of examination, dates and reasons for any adjournments, and date and results of final hearing. Some briefs have additional documentation attached. Arrangement of the records varied by district office. Generally, "admitted slips" were filed separately from "denied." Files are usually arranged by year, then alphabetically by name of petitioner or numerically by petition number. Occasionally, files are arranged chronologically by date of filing.
