



More than 60 federal agencies and offices were created between 1933 and 1939. Consequently, New Deal-era photographic records are spread across many different record groups and series. They will specifically focus on series that contain images related to New Deal arts and culture programs, public works programs, rural and farm assistance, and land and wildlife conservation.

## Beginning of the New Deal Era

"Our greatest primary task is to put people to work. This is no unsolvable problem if we face it wisely and courageously. It can be accomplished in part by direct recruiting by the Government itself, treating the task as we would treat the emergency of a war, but at the same time, through this employment, accomplishing greatly needed projects to stimulate and reorganize the use of our natural resources."

## **Presentation Goals**

Through the course of this presentation, we aim to provide a general overview of Still Picture Branch holdings that document New Deal-era programs and projects. We'll primarily highlight series that fall within the categories of:

- Arts and Culture Programs
- Public Works Programs
- Rural and Farm Assistance
- Land and Wildlife Conservation



We also hope to set expectations in terms of what researchers will and will not find among our holdings. Researchers should know that:

- The Still Picture Branch does not have photographs of individuals employed during the New Deal era.
- Our photographs primarily document the projects themselves, not necessarily the individuals that did the work.
- We do not have photographs of every project started or completed during the New Deal.
- New Deal photographs can be found across National Archives custodial units, and across the United States within many different archival and museum institutions.





#### 69-PR: Pictorial Report, ca. 1935-1943 (National Archives Identifier: 518281)

- These photos were to be used in a pictorial report on the WPA. Pictures were sent in to the DC office through May 1943. Includes photos taken in most states (including Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia), though Florida, Mississippi, Nevada, and the territory of Alaska are not present.
- The subjects of the photographs reflect the final organization of the WPA, which included the Division of Engineering and Construction, Division of Service Projects, and the Division of Training and Reemployment.

#### 69-PS: Reports of Progress of the Works Program, 1935–1941 (National Archives Identifier: 518282)

This series contains photographs used in the Reports on Progress of the Works Program. The reports were issued between March 1936 to June 1942. The photos for all reports, except June 1936 and June 1942, are in this series.

#### 69-MP: Photographs of WPA Projects and Activities, 1934–1942 (National Archives Identifier: 518259)

Contains photographs of various WPA projects and activities that were recorded by the Photographic Section and filed with the WPA's Information Division. Includes images of projects involving road construction, sewage improvements, public health, facilities for the people with disabilities, child and adult education, and aid to communities affected by natural disasters such as floods and drought.



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## Search Example - Grand Coulee Dam

- July 27, 1933, President Roosevelt appropriated \$63,000,000 for the beginning stages of the Grand Coulee Dam.
- As part of the Columbia Basin Project, the Bureau of Reclamation (Record Group 115) began construction of the Grand Coulee Dam in 1933.
- Bureau of Reclamation used workers for the Civilian Conservation Corps (Record Group 35) and the Works Progress Administration (Record Group 69).
- The Nez Perce and other tribes fought the construction of the dam. (Record Group 75: Records of the Bureau of Indian Affairs)







- Photographers: George W. Ackerman, E.F. Shipp, E.C. Purdy, F.S. Knoblock.
- Images document various activities of rural American life: maintenance and harvesting of crops, raising of livestock, production of goods, equipment, and community.
- There is also extensive coverage of Black Americans in rural areas, including images of Black extension service agents, farmers, their families, and Black communities.
- Photographs of other underrepresented groups, such as migrant Mexican farm workers, are also represented within Record Group 33.
- Limited photographic prints; negatives and slides are the predominant format.
- Extensive coverage of 4-H activities.



### 33-SC: Photographs of Extension Service Activities and Personnel, 1928–1943 (National Archives Identifier: <u>513408</u>)

- Only a handful of prints available.
- Finding aid consists of Xeroxed negative sleeves and their captions (when available). Many Xeroxed captions have been cut off, so researchers may find additional information directly on the negative sleeves.
- Organized by negative number and generally by date.
- 42 states represented to varying degrees (AK, CO, DE, HI, ID, IN, KY, PR, RI not included).
- Captions can include the name of the farm, land owner, or farmer. Most captions also note the county where the photograph was taken.
- About 20% of negatives have no caption information.
- Includes documentation of Extension Service agents and agency activities.



### Record Group 79: Overview

- On June 10, 1933, President Roosevelt signed Executive Order 6166 to consolidate all 64 existing federal parks, monuments, and historical sites under the National Park Service (NPS) in the Department of the Interior.
- Under the New Deal, eight national park acts were approved by Congress and signed by the President: Everglades, Great Smokey, Shenandoah, Big Bend, Olympic, Kings Canyon, Isle Royale, and Mammoth Cave. Additionally, 21 new national monuments were created, some of which later became national parks.



## Record Group 221: Overview

- Rural Electrification Administration (REA) staffers that took the photographs were often not photographers by profession. Because of this, most photos were developed and printed, but no real effort was made to identify or caption the images. Therefore, most negatives within Record Group 221 are not identified. Generally, however, the photos are in chronological order by month and year.
- There is a select list of negatives that was created to help researchers find groupings of images by topic. The list was made by the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association prior to transfer to the National Archives.
- A 1983 memo states that "much additional work needs to be done before the REA collection is fully usable. A complete cataloging would be a major project, involving research in publications to help identify subjects, times, and places. Perhaps someday it will be done. This effort is a beginning; we realize that many good or significant photographs remain to be discovered."
