Dear Mr. Siskel:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records in response to the systematic processing projects and Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests listed in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 40,194 pages, 893 assets, and 2 video clips have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 3,375 pages and 29 assets restricted in whole and 625 pages and 86 assets restricted in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 36,194 pages, 778 assets, and 2 video clips in whole and 625 pages and 86 assets in part. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President George W. Bush's representative, Freddy Ford, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is November 14, 2024, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

The George W. Bush Presidential textual records proposed for opening are correspondence, memoranda, invitations, printed emails, information sheets, agendas, schedules, notes, printed articles, lists, maps, reports, and speech drafts. Included are preparation materials for the filming of a documentary by RDF Media of Queen Elizabeth II's visit to the United States as well as the taping of ABC's Good Morning America at the White House. These are comprised of contracts, lists of potential interviewees, schedules, background information, and guidance for the individuals partaking in the interviews. In addition, there are several copies of President George W. Bush and Mrs. Laura Bush's schedules during the days of Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip's State Visit. Significant attention is devoted to the creation of guest lists for each official White House event held during the State Visit. The bulk of the remaining materials contain correspondence between staff members in the White House and Buckingham Palace, handwritten notes summarizing planning meetings, edits to the State Dinner menu, information sheets on the United Kingdom, biographies for Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip, and maps detailing personnel locations for the White House arrival ceremony. These materials are from the White House Office of Records Management Subject Files, White House Office of Communications, White House Counsel's Office, White House Gift Office, White House Office of Management and Administration, Office of Laura Bush, and White House Social Office. Electronic records proposed for opening consist of emails discussing scheduling of meetings to plan the visit, draft and final press statements and press releases, draft and final statements and speeches, planning emails, guest lists, schedules, media discussions, and protocol questions regarding the State Visit. These electronic records are from the Exchange Email, NSC Shared Drive, OA Shared Drive, and WHO Shared Drive Search and Access Sets.

The Subject Files are an alphabetical file regarding various subjects which include (but are not limited to Affordable Healthcare, Embryonic Stem Cell Research, Faith-Based and Community Initiatives, Immigration, Iraq (as well as numerous other countries), Social Security Reform, the Space Shuttle Columbia disaster, and Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD).
