Guidance for Improvement Based on 2024 Chief FOIA Officer Reports

Importance of FOIA Training and Role of CFO:

- Encourages CFOs to consider requiring all FOIA professionals attend substantive FOIA training each year and non-FOIA professionals to complete training upon hire, or more frequently as needed.
- Highlights OIP e-learning resources

FOIA Websites:

• Reminds agencies to keep websites current, including by removing outdated information.

Processing Requests for Expedition and Calculating Report Metrics

- Emphasizes importance of timely processing of requests for expedited processing
- Reminds agencies how to calculate agency overall medians and average as part of the Annual FOIA Report.



FOIA Reporting

- Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Annual FOIA Reports are due November 12, 2024.
- 2025 Chief FOIA Officer Reports are due January 13, 2025 for agencies that received 50 or more requests in FY 2023. Agencies that received fewer than 50 requests in FY 2023 that choose to report should submit by February 7, 2025.
- FY 2025 Quarter 1 data submissions are due January 31, 2025.

- OIP is available to provide specialized training for agencies upon request.




FOIA.gov Reminders


One Year of the FOIA.gov Search Tool – Stats and Highlights

- The search tool has been used over **120,000** times since its launch in October, 2023
- The search tool is the 5th most viewed page on FOIA.gov
- Over 140,000 queries have been submitted to the Search Tool



One Year of the Wizard Search Tool – Stats and Highlights

- Most users (**57%**) independently select the predefined user journeys
- Additional users (16%) are directed to the journeys based on their search terms
- The remaining **27%** of search terms entered into the Search Tool are followed-up with an agency or document recommendation result



The Wizard: Next Steps in Improving Search Results

- New technology currently in development will allow for improved searchability of frequently requested documents posted on agency websites
- Increased capabilities in searching for other forms of records including text messages, images, etc.
- Forthcoming proactive disclosures guidance will address how agencies post FOIA logs and frequently requested records, which will improve consistency and facilitate more robust and accurate search results.

FOIA Advisory Committee Recommendations to Council

- Recommendation **2024-06**: The Committee on Cross-Agency Collaboration and Innovation —COCACI—should organize agencies to participate in a "talent pool" posting through OPM.
- Recommendation **2024-07**: COCACI should create and maintain a database on its website of position descriptions in the Government Information Specialist (GIS) job series at various grades.

Recent Progress:


- FOIA Business Standards incorporated feedback following the public comment period.

Updates from the Technology Committee

In September 2018, the CFO Council established a technology committee to study the utilization and deployment of technology in FOIA programs across agencies, and to identify best practices and recommendations that can be implemented across agencies. Two senior FOIA professionals at the Department of Veterans Affairs and the National Institutes of Health cochair the Committee; membership includes FOIA professionals from several Department-level and independent agencies. The Committee liaises with the Council's co-chairs, the Directors of OIP and OGIS.



2024-11	The Chief FOIA Officers Council should form a working group to analyze the interest in and need for 1) a shared FOIA case management system and 2) a centralized records repository for use by federal agencies and the public.
2022-09	The Chief FOIA Officers Council should establish a working group to study and recommend resolutions to challenges between FOIA and section 508 compliance.
2022-08	The Chief FOIA Officers Council will establish a working group within two years to determine best practices for release of records in native format, including metadata.
