1.	<p>The Board has the jurisdiction to hear and determine appeals from formal orders of immigration judges involving deportation of aliens in the United States, discretionary relief from deportation, and the exclusion of aliens applying for admission to the United States. The Board also reviews appeals from orders of INS District Directors concerning petitions to classify the status of alien relatives for the issuance of immigrant visas, administrative fines imposed upon carriers because of violation of the immigration laws, bond and detention determinations, and other cases.</p> <p>The Board decisions represent the official action rendered by the Board in individual alien cases. These copies contain alien name, file number, decisions of the Board and immigration judge. They are the only collection of these decisions in existence. The Board of Immigration Appeals is the highest administrative tribunal charged with interpreting and applying the provisions of the immigration laws of the United States. 	<p>function since August 1940, and has at all times been entirely separate and apart from the Immigration and Naturalization Service. The Board historically has entered between 2,000 and 4,000 written decisions a year. A copy of each order is maintained at the Board. Access to these decisions is needed by the Board on a routine basis for review of the case history in conjunction with requests for stays of <del>of</del> deportation and less frequently in conjunction with motions to reopen where the alien's individual file maintained by the Immigration and Naturalization Service cannot be located or is incomplete. Such stay requests and motions can arise many years after the Board's original adjudication of an appeal; however, the frequency of need diminishes as the years pass. Additionally, the Board and its staff use this collection of decisions for research purposes. Although a copy of each Board order is maintained in the individual file of an alien involved in proceedings, it would be impossible within any reasonable budgetary and manpower constraints to reassemble a collection of Board decisions for any given period.</p> <p><u>DISPOSITION.</u> Retire to the Federal Archives and Records Center in five year blocks when 10 years old. Destroy 50 years from the last year of the five year block. ESTIMATED ANNUAL VOLUME: Five cubic feet. INITIAL VOLUME OF RECORDS (1960 - 1972) 40 cubic feet.</p>
