Dear Kim Tart,

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has been notified of a potential alteration of records at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). A member of the public has alleged that VA employees altered an SF-50 (Notification of Personnel Action) and an SF-180 (Request Pertaining to Military Records) or did not properly report the records status.

In accordance with 36 CFR 1230.14(a), NARA requests that VA respond within 30 calendar days to this allegation. If it is determined that an alteration or unauthorized disposition of records has occurred, the response should include the following information:

- A complete description of the records with volume and dates if known;
- The office maintaining the records;
- A statement of the exact circumstances surrounding the removal, defacing, alteration, or
- destruction of records;
- A statement of the safeguards established to prevent further loss of documentation; and
- Details of the actions taken to salvage, retrieve, or reconstruct the records.

If it is determined that there has been no unauthorized disposition, please provide us with sufficient documentation to support that finding. I appreciate your attention to this matter. If you have any questions or wish to discuss further, please contact me at laurence.brewer@nara.gov.

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) acknowledges receipt of the Department of Veterans Affairs' (VA) report regarding the alleged alteration or loss of records from a veteran's Official Military Personnel File (OMPF).

According to the report, the VA records officer researched the matter and determined that no evidence exists to indicate that any records were altered or lost. In subsequent correspondence, VA noted that the veteran submitted a FOIA request for the records back in August of 2022. The VA FOIA Office thoroughly reviewed the submission and determined that no records responsive to the request exist.

Based on this information, the reporting requirements of 36 CFR 1230.14 have been met and NARA considers this matter closed. I appreciate your attention to this matter.
