Dear Ms. Slaughter,

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has received an allegation of unauthorized disposition of records at the Department of Labor (DOL), Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). A member of the public has alleged that OSHA destroyed a letter that was addressed to them in relation to OSHA Complaint 1946326. Please see enclosures for additional information.

In accordance with 36 CFR 1230.14(a), NARA requests that OSHA respond to this allegation within 30 calendar days. If it is determined that an unauthorized disposition of records has occurred, the response should include the following information:

- A complete description of the records with volume and dates if known;
- The office maintaining the records;
- A statement of the exact circumstances surrounding the removal, defacing, alteration, or destruction of records;
- A statement of the safeguards established to prevent further loss of documentation; and
- Details of the actions taken to salvage, retrieve, or reconstruct the records.

If it is determined that there has been no unauthorized disposition, please provide sufficient documentation to support that finding. I appreciate your attention to this matter.
