I received your letter of August 27th just before moving to Decatur, and though I did not get to see Jose in person I did talk to laria. She informed me that her husband had written you the week before, that he had already sent to you your typewritar and other articles. In pe you have received them by this time.

I am very glad to know that your article on Africa has been published. Such things as that keeps us on the front line of battle, so keep up the good work. I am also very glad to inform you that, through an address you gave me, the IOJ, I am now writing for three publications. One is in Moscow, one is in mast Germany and the other is in Prague. Meedless to say, I am a member, and a very proud one, of the above mentioned organization. As of this date my contributions have been very small, what with the moving and the changing of jobs and such, but I am in the process of setting up a system whereby I can produce and submit to these publications on a require basis. I only hope my material will be acceptable.

I am not too surprised that you got something of the runaround while you were in Cuba. The government is young and inexperienced and learning, largely, by the trial and error method.
Then too, you are an American, and to know what thet means to a
Cuban one must live with them for a long time. Pertago I flatter
myself but I think I understand them, and the most time you visit
there I would like to give you a letter of introduction to some
friends of mine in Havana. Through these friends I had no trouble
in cetting conceration from both the offices of Juan Orta and Dr.
Reul Roa. Had I known you were going to have the trouble you did
I vould have offered to assist you, though at the time, especially
on such a very brief acquaintance, it would have seemed as if I
were shoving myself forward.

I certainly home you are successful in getting to Panama City. I would like to read some truth from there. By the way, if your duties ever bring you to Atlanta I want you to come to my house to stay, I want you to consider it yours as long as you like. We are poor working folks, but whatever we have I want you to think of it as your own. And if there is any way I can help the movement from this part of the country I would appreciate your letting me how.

During an improspect (non-semestical side trip spinare Barlovento or as it is better known, to rain and therefore a beach recort and marina located just outsits daywar along the coast, Sr. Luis Martines Paule and myself propost to inspect the newly constructed tourist attraction; couplete with Cabuses, restaurant, and dooring mailities for all types of beats.
