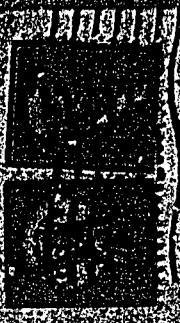

Miami Group Making Plans To Invade Cuba

MIAMI, Fla. (AP) — A group of about 100 Americans, including several former military officers, are making plans to invade Cuba, according to a report in the Miami Herald newspaper.

The group, known as the "Miami Group," is being organized by a former Marine Corps aviator, James Earl Ray, who is now living in Miami. The group's plan is to land on the Cuban coast and overthrow the Communist government of Fidel Castro, the Herald said.

Some United States members of the group are now in Miami but most Cubans signed up are in New York, the newspaper said.

Among those the Herald said are:

- Frank Baker**, 38, of Durham, N.C., who said he spent five years in the Korean War fighting Communism.
- Alvin** (name obscured), 31, of Rochester, N.Y., who said he spent 1 1/2 years in the Communist camp. He wants to help his country.
- William** (name obscured), 35, of New York, who said he was in the U.S. Army for three years and served in the Korean War. He hopes to get a better life in Cuba.
- Charles** (name obscured), 31, of Rock, N.Y., who said he always wanted to be in the army but had no chance.
- Charles** (name obscured), 31, of Cuba, former Provisional, who was a soldier in the Batista army during the war.
- Ken** (name obscured), 31, of Boston, Mass., who said he was a paratrooper in the United States Army for five years and has no immediate family. He said he is the leader of the American group headed for Cuba.
- Alvin** (name obscured), 31, from (name obscured).
