 Citizenship Status of ANGLATT-1

1. Pursuant to the discussions held in the summer and fall of 1961 between WFO, WINSLOW and JOHN WINSLOW representatives, concerning the possible manner of action by which ANGLATT-1 might regain his citizenship, WFO has made inquiries to determine the feasibility of re-initiating a private bill in Congress, based on ANGLATT-1's past services to certain U.S. organizations.

2. WFO has advised that ANGLATT-1 furnished those information "of minor importance"; the Bureau of Customs and the Executive Bureau had no record of ANGLATT-1. WFO, after repeated inquiries, has informed us that they cannot locate ANGLATT-1's file.

3. It would seem that a new private bill would have as little hope of success as the two previously introduced, since a strong case cannot be made for L-1's prior services, based on the weak or negative replies noted above, and it is currently possible to request a legal re-consideration of the basis for WFO's action to strip L-1 of citizenship, since the file is missing.

4. It is recommended, therefore, that the best method whereby ANGLATT-1 can regain his citizenship is to apply at the nearest consulate overseas for an immigrant visa. Mexico City is the most likely place. If WFO and ANGLATT-1 agree to do this, Headquarters will be glad to assist in expediting the visa issuance.

The possible course of action by which citizenship, AMELATTOR-1 has made inquiries to determine the feasibility of re-initiating a private bill in Congress, based on AMELATTOR-1's past services to anti-Communist organizations.

2. IWHI has advised that AMELATTOR-1 furnished them information of "minor importance"; the Bureau of Customs and the Narcotics Bureau had no record of AMELATTOR-1. IWHI, after repeated inquiries, has informed us that they cannot locate AMELATTOR-1's file.

3. It would seem that a new private bill would have to be introduced during the two sessions introduced since AMELATTOR-1's prior service, based on the work of AMELATTOR-1's past efforts, but it is certainly possible to request a legal re-examination of the basis for the action to strip AMELATTOR-1 of citizenship, since the file is missing.

4. It is recommended, therefore, that AMELATTOR-1 can regain his citizenship is to apply at the Mexican Consulate Overseas for an immigrant visa. Mexico City is the most likely point of entry, and IWHI agree to do this. Headquarters will be glad to assist in expediting the visa issuance.
