Ossenbrink by true name as early as March 1960, at which time Ossenbrink dealt with SLOBODA officially in the producing of East German city plans and other materials for CATHINK, Since & occupying the CATHINK offices in late May of 1960, Ossenbrink saw SLOBODA about three times in the latter's office, each of which risits concerned the acquisition of basic Intelligence materials (e.g. Mast German telephone books, city plans, etc.) Ossenbrink did not indicate to SLOBODA the reason for Ossenbrink's request for these materials, but SLOBODA did know Ossenbrink's phone extension at Camp King, since Ossenbrink occasionally left word with SLOBODA for SLOBODA's superior, Mr. Len Meller, Chief of Publications Procurement Section, to phone Ossenbrink for official purposes.
