1. CARACAS ENGLISH LANGUAGE NEWSPAPER "THE DAILY JOURNAL" OF 2 MARCH HAS FOLLOWING EDITORIAL COMMENT ENTITLED "THE NEW YORK TIMES AGAIN":

TEXT: "WHAT IS THE NEW YORK TIMES TRYING TO DO? IT PRINTED AN ERRONEOUS REPORT SLANDERING THE ^{HEAD} HAD OF A FRIENDLY STATE, BASED ON RUMORS WHICH ITS OWN CORRESPONDENT ADMITTED WERE NOT FULLY CHECKED OUT. ^{THIS} THIS ACTION CAUSED A SERIOUS DIPLOMATIC INCIDENT WHICH WAS SETTLED ONLY THROUGH THE PERSONAL INTERVENTION OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE USA.

NOW, THE NEW YORK DAILY, IN AN APPARENT ATTEMPT TO SALVAGE ITS REPUTATION, HAS DUG UP A SELF-PROCLAIMED FORMER CIA OFFICIAL WHO SAYS THAT THE CIA ^{GAVE} GVE MONEY TO THE GOVERNMENT HERE, NOT TO ANY INDIVIDUAL.

LAST NIGHT, THE VENEZUELAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALLY AND EMPHATICALLY DENIED THIS REPORT.
