MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Views of ANMAIL-3 on Current Cuban Exile Situation

1. The most logical action for ANCIAR and the one most urgently needed is the selection of a single chairman to replace the rule-by-committee that is now employed by ANCIAR.
2. The most obvious choice for chairman is ANERIK.
3. Because of the bitter personal differences between ANERIK and ANER, the selection of ANERIK as chairman could very well bring about the resignation of ANER from ANCIAR. This would not in the least weaken ANCIAR and might in fact strengthen it.
4. The views expressed above are those of ANMAIL-3, who made a special trip to the Headquarters area on 1 September to meet Paul J. FRENCH and discuss these matters with him. The meeting lasted from 1630 until 1930 hours in a local hotel room.
5. As ANMAIL-3 sees it, the selection of a single chairman would automatically solve several of the current problems of ANCIAR. For example, it would speed the decision-making process. It would force ANERIK to work for the common good rather than his own partisan political interests. It would present the uncommitted Cuban exiles with a strong personality around whom they could rally in the traditional Latin pattern.
6. ANMAIL-3 paints quite an encouraging picture regarding the Miami office of ANRASP, but he says the good talent assigned by the majority of ANCIAR to head up the Miami office is being frustrated by the unilateral actions of ANER-1, who refuses to be bound by decisions which ANCIAR took in his absence. Two good examples are the following:

a. ANCIAR since ANER-1 chose ~~ROBERTO~~ ^{actually Aug. Yndegui} ~~Verde~~ (fma) as head of the Communications Committee. ~~ROBERTO~~ Verde is a graduate of MIT and an instructor there. He was granted leave without pay by MIT to accept the ANRASP post. ANMAIL-3 has the highest respect for him. However, when ANER-1 returned to Miami he immediately insisted on putting one of his men, CAPU (fma), in as head of the Communications Committee. CAPU was formerly a part of the ~~same~~ organization of the 60 of July movement. He operated in Havana. He is probably well-qualified for the job but he is completely loyal to ANER-1 and was not the choice of ANCIAR for the chairmanship.

b. Colonel ~~MATEO~~ ~~Rios~~ is an outstanding figure and the best possible choice to head up the military committee. Although he was only issued a cautious verbal invitation to leave Cuba and join ANRASP by ANCIAR at the outset, his response was immediate acceptance, to the surprise of ANCIAR.

Since his arrival in Miami he has impressed

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ASMAIL-3 and others as a strong leader, honest, dedicated and professionally competent. Here again, however, ASKIB-1 wishes to replace MARTIN with Colonel Oscar RIAL. A struggle for power is under way between MARTIN Escob and RIAL, much to the detriment of ASHARP's military effort.

7. At the instructions of the ANEHEAR members in Mexico, ASKIB-1 was to arrive in Miami on 11 August to put ASKIB-1 in his place. ASMAIL-3 is hopeful that this meeting will have the desired effect. He has promised to provide a private report on the outcome to MURDOCK.

8. Among the other five members of ANEHEAR there is good faith. They do not see eye to eye in all matters, but they are willing in the interest of unity to resolve their differences in a civilized manner.

9. In reply to a query concerning Major Paul CHIRAS, ASMAIL-3 gave an unfavorable description. He called CHIRAS a person of little moral fiber who has been crying, without success, to form a competing organization headed by himself, ASCHIRP-1 and ASMAIL-4.
