was obviously referring to the name Adda used prior to coming to Helsinki. tity 4. we never referred to the name that attacks used officially in Helsin-i. Co. Plake only commented that he did not know anyone in Felsinki 4 with a name similar to CKRESIN. The conversation continued in general terms about remmark, the Danish language, and sports. REMECV brought up the last subject and asked if Collins participated in any aparts. Collins mentioned both tennie and squash. It have expressed an interest in squash. and said he had never heard of the game before. Le maked if Costille would be willing to teach him to play. 10. Tilds answered in the affirmative, and ICEAROV said he would telephone Conflict during the following week. LOBANCY I then offered Coffine some food, excused himself. and joined another group of people. CCCMLLE did not talk to .ICHARCY 1 again except to thank the latter for the party and to say goodbye. ICRANOV's a wife came up to COSTILLE near the end of the party when COSTILLS was talking to Iden-LIFEKIT shortly left, and LUSAKOV's's wife and COSTILLE continued 11ty 7.7 talking for about 20 minutes. She looks to be in her late twenties, is quite attractive and was nicely dressed. She is a little shy but is quite well poised and does not seem ill at ease in talking with westerners. She also made a good impression on the others present, including the wives. She will obviously be an asset to LOBANCV I in his diplomatic career. She speaks some English, but her vocabulary is quite limited. She seems to be fairly well educated, and she referred once or twice to "the institute in Moscow" which she had attended. She said she was born in the north Caucasus. Politics were not discussed at all. She made no derogatory comments about their last post in I Oslo , nor about Dermark or toe United States. She said she liked living in Cslo j and thought it a beautiful country.

3. We do not know LOBANCV's a motive in tringing up A LADLE's name. COSTILLE and LOBANCV , were standing alone at the time but the room was crowded and several groups of people sere talking nearby. I LORANOV's question about ASLANG was very matter-of-fact, and he did not lower his voice or ask the question in a furtive manner. However, the room was fairly noisy, and LOBANOV would have probably realised that the conversation could not be overheard. It is somewhat strange he referred to ARLADLE by "GOLUBTSIN" 6 name rather than the actual name A LADLE used in Helsinki. VONABOL 11 had mentioned the name AcidDic used in Helsinkil, COSTILLE would have probably admitted knowing AMLADLA. To have done otherwise would have been an obvious lie. we can only guess at this stage of the contact that IOBANOV was simply interested in finding out what happened to ANIADLE. It would seem logical that LOBANOV had known previously that COUTLINE has had some contact with AEL-DLR in Helsinki. Ferhaps LORANOV's's motive will become evident in subsequent contacts. As of this writing he has not attempted to recontact COSTILLE. We will keep Headquarters informed.
