It should be noted that Carrillo's examples are interesting - they are all examples
of first echelon Communists' who have been dismissed (Edith Garcia Buchaca) or who
have had their spheres of influence decreased (Carlos Rafael Rodriguez and Manuel
Luzardo). Now, NIFASH says the CP is putting its men in "planning ministries" ~~and~~
~~institutions~~ as replacements for inept Fidelistas. What is meant by "planning
ministries"? NIFASH also says that the CP/~~institutions~~ in Cubanetales is increasing in
