71 415 1. G-2 reported that an 7 May 1950 a B-26 type bonter arrived in David, Panama, from Brownsville, Texas, due to a low gosoline supply. The plane, was headed for Tocumen Airport in Panena City, and carried as a crew the following according to

Frank O'GFL, U.S. Citizen, Pilot O. MARTHEZ, U.S. Citizen, Co-Pilot Steve MUREAY, U.S. Citizen, Machanic Mauricio Castro, Panananian, Passenger

(A tire blew out at Lavid, and lir. John Linch, Civil Aeronautics technician at Tocumen Airport was instrumental in getting a spare tire to them,

2. Wr. Linch advised this office that he had not Stove KURRAY in Havana in

April 1950 in company with a fellow ramed 203 HILO, who elaimed to have some connection with the Secret Police in-Fexico-S [Liang] described MURRAY has an advonturor who had been in the Philippines and the Far East and whom he suspected of gold smuggling activities. [Lind] and that MURRAY was pilot of the plane and he thought it was unusual that eo feet a plane as this and as expensive to operate was being used when it had comparatively little cargo space. In May 1950, when kunkay was in Panama, he told limed that he was buying orchid bulte.

5. On 16 June 1950 the following information was received from Civil Intelligence Section, Panama Canal, regarding this matter:

"It has been reported that Very frequently a B-26 simplifie (NSS46N - a Martin Manaudor) makes trips between Tocumen and David, R.F. It is piloted by Steve MURRAY, and/at least two other Americans ride on the plane, which to who sometimes met at Tocumen Airport by either Tito, Harmodito or Toni ARIAS. On landing at the airport it goes directly to a hangar, and allegedly the only ones who visit it are the ARIAS brothers, PASTOR Pence, Chief of the airport, and one (fnu) LINARES, Chief of Cuttoms at Tocumen. 3,5 700

Finformant stated that it was believed at first that the plane was engaged in arms contraband, but later it appeared more logical to assume that it was involved in another type of smuggling, possibly drugs.

FVirgilio RAVIPEZ, then Chief of the Control Tower, is said to have stated that the plane comes and sees without toing registered at the airport under orders of Portis Airportohanster; that the place lands without signalfing

by radio or talking to anyone for four of detecting at Altrook Minld, but that it is signaled by mouse of a light which indicates that the field is a free for leading. The above information was allegedly given to President ARIAS by the Minister of Government and Justice, and he appearently showed little interest in the subject, morely stating that the matter should be investigated to see what there is to it.

Upon receipt of this information it appeared that Tirrillo RAWTREZ might have been the source, since he was fired from his post at Tocumen Airport and was discounted about it. It was excertained that the information contained in the labors paragraph, in which RAWIREZ is mentioned, was reported by RAWIREZ but the other information cans from other Civil Intelligence sources.

4. In 6 July [17. Line] advised that the show-plane and Steve NURRAY had returned to Farma and that the limister of Government had ordered that the plane by disconticed and searched, but he could not accertain the basis for the searched. Like [18] had talked to the Kanager of the dirport, Parael Pistor Ponce, and with Toni lais. Director Gonoral of Civil Aeronautics, and a nophew of President Arias, who indicated that they were aware of the kinister of Government's order but did not know what was behind it. Both felt that it was an extreme measure, which should not be carried out.

5. On S July 1950 Kr. MURRAY called at the Embassy to obtain assistance in securing the release of his plane. Briefly he stated that he had departed from Mexico City via Managua and arrived at Tocumen at 7:30 p.m. 5 July. His passport reflected the following:

He stated that he was in the export-import business and that he dealt in gold. He said that he had come to Fancra to see a man by the mane of SiS, a gold dealer from Buones Aires, about gold shipments.

6. On 8 July, Einister of Government Alfredo Allie reported the matter to the U.S. Ambassador stating that prior to arriving in itemata the plane had been signaled, that all was not well at the airport and that the crew had jettisoned cargo prior to arrival. (A check with the Air Force authorities does not confirm that any such message was sent and Funday denies that any thing was jettisoned. He insisted that he was coming to Panama to discuss the gold business but that he had no cargo.) The Finister also advised the Ambassador that PANTOR Ponce had been fired as Read of the airport.

Was advised that PASTOR Ponce and EURRAY on the night of 8 July LINGUM was advised that PASTOR Ponce had, in fact, been fired and that he was determined to bump off Toni ARIAS. Both FURRILY and PASTOR Fonce claimed that Toni ARIAS was behind it all but that PASTOR Ponce was the fell two.

6. The Mexican/referred to, Acristobal MATINE, and the Mexican ZORING, as oblived to be identical. Sas has toen identified as Fornarders, a gold dealer, who operates in Busines Aircs and Montevides. Civil Intelligence Settion has advised that Sas was staying with Toni ARIS and that Wish had departed. From Panama hastily. CIS also-advised that President MRISS and thirt-Wish had departed orders for the/dismissal of both his nephew, Toni Mills at first-had given it was later agreed that Toni ARIS would not be fired to avoid a public scandle Toy.

9. The present status of the matter is that the plane has been searched with negative results, that the plane is still being held by the Panamarian authorities and that MURRY and others are endeavoring by every means possible to secure the release of the plane. The head of the Documen Airport, PASTOR Ponce, has been dismissed and Toni ARIAS, the President's repres, will probably be allowed to withdraw from his position gracefully.

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
