Next, I was assigned to Harrisburg to cover the State
Legislature for a year and a half, worked on a team investigating
political payoffs and contributions. Then became "idea man"

for about a year. My best idea was to go to Europe and cover
the American troops during peacetime. Then I asked for and got
an assignment to Vietnam where I wrote a series of articles just
as the United States was getting heavily involved. Also wrote
a series about the peace-keeping forces in Cyprus

Assigned as an assistant city editor to the copy desk, filling in as deputy city editor. Headed a Bulletin investigative reporting team that "broke" the FHA scandal in Philadelphia and resulted in a federal grand ju ry.

Was sent to a city editor's seminar at American Press
Institute, then at Columbia University, and a short while later
was appointed deputy city editor; in charge of assigning most
news stories. In that capacity I also helped train young writers
and reporters. Then assigned to the national desk, which handles
Washington, national and internation news; Started a weekly
column called World in Conflict.

Outside the Bulletin, I did some freelance work. Most notably I was Philadelphia area correspondent for Time and Fortune in 1957, worked part time at the N. Y. Daily News in 1968, wrote a number of articles for Philadelphia magainze.

Honors and awards: First prize for court reporting from the Pennsylvania Newspaper Publishers Association; National Certificate of Merit, Amvets, 1965, for the Vietnam series. Served as treasurer, Pen and Pencil club and vice president and director, Phila. Press Association.

Dear Dick:

I've been following the progress of the House Select
Committee on Assassinations and its chief counsel as well as
newspaper and wire service stories permit.

I gather, at least from a Newhouse News Service report, that the committee unanimously has agreed to support your request for a staff of 170 but that the actual funding will not follow until after January 1.

If that's the case, and you can use me now, I'd like to come to Washington and get involved as early as possible. I think I can be more effective in the role of press liaison officer if I arrive on the scene before the great bulk of the staff.

I have received a formal letter from Bulletin management confirming an extended lewve of absence. But this does not preclude a short-term leave. Even if Congress ultimately refuses to fund the investigations fully and they are cut short, I feel I could return to the Bulletin without loss of face or funds. The experience of working for even a few weeks or months with the committee would be worth the effort.

Also, even though I would move to Washington immediately, Shirley and Sharon would remain in Philadelphia to June 30.

I, therefore, would not get involved with a long-term & lease until the summer. So, if the investigations are terminated early, there would be little financial hardship on my part.

I understand that you are extremely busy at this point, preparing a budget and interviewing prospective staff members. But I would appreciate a call at your convenience.

My concern is that he may become permanent.

I'm also happy to tell you that The Bulletin has granted me an extended leave of absence. In fact, management, I am told, was "thrilled" with the idea.

The leave was granted in record time. This was a surprise. I thought it would take weeks of negotiation. That's why i went ahead and requested it now instead of waiting.

Of course, I explained in writing to The Bulletin that if for some reason the House does not provide sufficient funds for the dual investigation, the deal is off.

Now that The Bulletin has been apprised of the situation,

I feel very little notice is required. This means I could start
as your press secretary soon after things are worked out with
the House committee.

I hope that is soon. I am anxious to get involved as early as possible.

Meanwhile, I'm reading extensively in the Kennedy-King literature. I'm also meeting with an old friend, the press officer for the Federal Energy Administration here, to get some ideas about dealing with the media from the other side of the fence.

I will be in Washington, Monday and Tuesday, Nov. 8 and 9,

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to attend information seminars with my daughter, Sharon, at the three universities. As I told you, she plans to go to Georgetown, American or George Washington.

If it's all right with you, I'd like to stop into the temporary offices of the House Select Committee on Assassinations when I'm down there.
