The three individuals began discussing the JOSEPH VALACHI story which is currently appearing in the newspapers, and GLEASON was of the opinion that VALACHI's testimony was all hearsay, and that nothing would come out of it. However, NOONAN offered to bet GLEASON that more than one indictment "comes out" of the VALACHI testimony. GLEASON remarked "what do those guys care about that" referring to members of Cosa Nostra. NOONAN indicated it would "cost those guys a fortune", and to which GLEASON remarked "they got it."

TEDDY GLEASON then remarked that TOMMY (GLEASON, JR.) is going to sue the Waterfront Commission, the newspaper, and all the writers for the story that appeared in the papers concerning allegations that TOMMY GLEASON has profited from ILA business because of his father, TEDDY GLEASON. TEDDY GLEASON remarked that a lawyer can't be "schmeared", and TOMMY is not going to take it.

AUSTIN FUREY then asked GLEASON when GLEASON was taking over the Presidency of the ILA. GLEASON remarked he was taking over Friday night (8/16/63). GLEASON also remarked that the ILA is \$1,234,000 in the hole, and that he is not satisfied with the audit. He also indicated he was "going to get out of here and find a place to go". AUSTIN FUREY questioned whether GLEASON was going to Washington, and GLEASON indicated "no", and that he was going to talk to the executive board Friday about that.

It is noted that NY 4091-PC has advised that GLEASON apparently is going to ignore the resolution passed at the ILA convention to move the headquarters of the ILA from New York to Washington, D. C. NY 4091-PC further advised that GLEASON, JOHN BOWERS and FRED FIELD, newly elected Executive Vice-President and General Organizer, respectively, had been looking over rental space at 17 Battery Place, in an apparent attempt to lease space there for the ILA.
