LETTERS RECEIVED BY THE SECRETARY OF WAR MAIN SERIES 1801-1870

On the 317 rolls of this microfilm publication are reproduced unbound letters, with their enclosures, that were received by the Secretary of War during the period 1801-70.

The Department of War was created by an act of Congress approved August 7, 1789, which made the Secretary of War responsible for all matters relating to military and naval affairs, including Indian affairs, military pensions, and the granting of bounty lands for military service. On April 30, 1798, the Department of the Navy was created, and naval affairs were withdrawn from the jurisdiction of the Secretary of War.

It soon became apparent that the responsibilities of the Secretary of War were too great for continued effective supervision by one office, and various subordinate units were established to handle specific functions. Among those established before the Civil War were the following offices or departments: Quartermaster's Ordnance, Adjutant General's, Medical, Inspector General's, Engineer, Pay, and Subsistence. Offices (or Bureaus) of Bounty Lands, Pensions, and Indian Affairs had also been established within the Department by 1824. But in 1849 these were transferred with their functions and most of their records to the Department of the Interior. During the Civil War several new offices or bureaus were established, including the following: The Office of the Chief Signal Officer; the Bureau of Military Justice (later the Judge Advocate General's Department); the Office of the Commissary General of Prisoners; the Provost Marshal General's Bureau; and the Bureau of Refugees, Freedmen, and Abandoned Lands. Thus the concern of the Secretary's office became more and more restricted to matters of broad policy and general administration.

The letters and enclosures here reproduced were received from officials of subordinate bureaus of the War Department, officials of other executive departments, Army officers and civilian agents in the field, Governors of States and Territories, the President, Members of Congress, and private persons. They relate to such topics as Indian affairs, fortifications for defense of the country's coasts and frontiers, military campaigns, the construction and opening of military roads, the organization and strength of the Army, the furnishing of subsistence for armies in the field, and the assignment and activities of Army personnel. The letters here reproduced encompass the years 1801 to 1870, and are part of the largest series of letters received by the Office of the Secretary of War. The entire series covers the period from 1801 to 1889.

The series is quite fragmentary for the period 1801-14 and contains no letters of earlier date than 1801. This lack of early documentation is traceable to the fire that occurred in the War Department on November 8, 1800, which destroyed practically all the records of the Department. Other early records were lost or destroyed when the Government buildings in Washington were burned in 1814.

According to the recordkeeping practice of the time, letters received were entered in registers alphabetically by the initial letter of the surname or office of the writer and thereunder chronologically by date of receipt. The 'I' and ''J' letters were intermingled. The letters are arranged to correspond with the arrangement of entries in the registers and are numbered as follows: (1) from February 1801 to August 1835, in a separate sequence for each letter of the alphabet through the period covered by the controlling register; (2) from September 1835 to December 1838, in a separate sequence for each letter of the alphabet running through the whole period; and (3) from January 1839 to December 1870, in a separate sequence for each letter of the alphabet through each year.

Since the letters were numbered and entered in the registers according to the dates of receipt rather than the dates of writing, and since there often was a considerable lapse of time between the date of writing and the receipt of a letter in the Office of the Secretary, there is some overlapping of dates covered by the registers. This overlapping is reflected in the filing arrangement of the letters.

The letters received were endorsed on the back or on a separate cover sheet with the name of the writer, the date of writing, the place of writing, the purport of the contents, the date received, and, after August 1835, the file number from the register. Other information occasionally written on the back of a letter included brief comments by the Secretary and the date of reply.

Some of the letters of the Civil War period were selected for possible publication in <u>The War of the Rebellion</u>, A Compilation of the Official Records of the Union and Confederate Armies (Washington, 1880-1901). The letters selected bear the distinguishing circular stamp "Copied, War Records, 1861-1865." File numbers in the style of "A 61 (37)" appear on all the letters. The letters received after August 1835 also bear numbers in the style "A 61 (1835)." "A" is the initial letter of the correspondent's name or office; "61" indicates that it is the 61st letter recorded under "A"; "37" is the number of the register; and "1835" is the year the letter was received.

Many of the letters for the period from 1840 to 1870 bear file citations other than those given to them by the Office of the Secretary. These citations indicate that at one time or another the letters had been filed in some other office. In some instances, but especially during the period from 1861 to 1870, the files include the working papers, the original draft, or a true copy of the letter sent in reply. On the back of such a document appear the name of the person to whom the reply was addressed and the number and page of the volume of letters sent in which the official copy of the reply is entered.

Some of the letters originally filed in the Office of the Secretary are no longer in the series, others are incomplete, and some enclosures have become separated from the transmittal letters. Many of the registered communications were referred to other offices or agencies for action and eventually became incorporated into the files of those agencies. Letters relating to personnel matters, for example, were extracted from the files and transferred to the records of the Office of The Adjutant General. Other records were lost, destroyed, or carried away during the intervening years.

In some instances cross-reference slips have been inserted in place of the letters extracted. Some of these cross-reference slips give the name of the writer, the reference number, the date of transfer, and the name of the bureau to which the records were transferred. Others simply give the file number and the agency to which the records were transferred. There are also a few War Department chargeout cards that simply indicate that certain records were removed from the files on a given date.

For the period 1861-70 the letters received by the Secretary of War are indexed by name and partially by subject in a series of volumes (reproduced on Microcopy 495). The indexes were prepared from the registers and cover all letters regardless of whether or not they are still in this series.

There are a number of shorter series of letters received by the Office of the Secretary that were maintained concurrently with this series during the 1860-70 period. These include the Letters Received by the Secretary of War, Irregular Series, 1861-66 (Microcopy 492); and the Letters Received by the Secretary of War From the President, Executive Departments, and War Department Bureaus, 1862-70 (Microcopy 494). There are also two small series of letters received for the period 1863-65: The first, from the Commissary General of Prisoners; the second, from the Commissioner of Exchange of Prisoners. Yet other series are Confidential and Unofficial Letters Received, 1832-41 (including two letters of 1846); and Letters Received by the Secretary of War, Unregistered Series, 1789-1861 (Microcopy 222).

The above-mentioned series of unregistered letters consists of letters, documents, and loose papers for which no entries were found in registers of letters received. Beginning with 1862 similar documents are filed in the main series here reproduced. They are arranged by initial letter of the name of the writer or office and filed by year at the end of the registered letters bearing the same initial letter. If the writer's name is not given, the document is filed by initial letter of the subject. A relatively few undated and unidentified papers are filed at the end of the entire series.

The letters here reproduced are part of Record Group 107, Records of the Office of the Secretary of War.

In the same record group there are other related records. Among them are Registers of Letters Received by the Secretary of War, Main Series, 1800-70 (Microcopy 22); Registers of Letters Received by the Secretary of War, Irregular Series, 1861-66 (Microcopy 491); Registers of Letters Received by the Secretary of War From the President, Executive Departments, and War Department Bureaus, 1862-70 (Microcopy 493); Letters Sent by the Secretary of War to the President and Executive Departments, 1863-70 (Microcopy 421); Letters Sent by the Secretary of War Relating to Military Affairs, 1800-89 (Microcopy 6); Indexes to Letters Sent by the Secretary of War Relating to Military Affairs, 1871-89 (Microcopy 420); Confidential and Unofficial Letters Sent by the Secretary of War, 1814-47 (Microcopy 7); Letters Sent to the President by the Secretary of War, 1800-63 (Microcopy 127); Reports to Congress From the Secretary of War, 1803-70 (Microcopy 220); Miscellaneous Letters Sent by the Secretary of War, 1800-1809 (Microcopy 370); and Orders and Endorsements Sent by the Secretary of War, 1846-70 (Microcopy 444).

In Record Group 15, Records of the Veterans Administration, there are records relating to military-pension and bounty-land matters for the period when those matters were under the jurisdiction of the Secretary of War. In Record Group 75, Records of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, there are Letters Sent by the Secretary of War Relating to Indian Affairs, 1800-24 (Microcopy 15); Letters Sent by the Office of Indian Affairs, 1824-81 (Microcopy 21); Letters Received by the Office of the Secretary of War Relating to Indian Affairs, 1800-23 (Microcopy 271); Registers of Letters Received by the Office of Indian Affairs, 1824-80 (Microcopy 18); and Letters Received by the Office of Indian Affairs, 1824-80 (Microcopy 234).
