a joint effort between the International Trade Administration (and its predecessors) and businessmen and other prominent community and state government leaders in the western United States to keep the private sector informed of Federal policies and programs that might affect local communities. Specifically, the WITG serves as an information channel to keep business current with major developments in government programs, services, and policies concerning domestic and foreign economic developments which bear on their activities. Further, it provides a sample of leading businessmen on which to test the feasibility, acceptability, and probable effectiveness of proposed new measures and from which to derive an indication of the problems and complaints uppermost in business thinking. WITG also serves as a clearing house among business for their own information and for ideas respecting new technical and economic developments of mutual interest.

Membership, by invitation only, consists of acknowledged leaders in the international trading community represented by manufacturers, bankers, academicians and officials of state governments, regional federations and Chambers of Commerce. International Trade Administration District Office Directors and designated international trade specialists located in the Western states furnish Federal membership.

Until 1975, the semi-annual meetings were jointly chaired by a private sector member and the Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Commerce. Other upper-echelon ITA personnel from Washington, generally at the office or division director level, addressed meetings. ITA also provided the executive secretary for the group. Since then, ITA involvement has been downgraded. It no longer acts in a secretariat capacity, though it continues to answer inquiries from the association about international trade and related matters, and to supply speakers.

The files are arranged chronologically by date of meeting and thereunder, alphabetically by subject. Included here are agendas, briefing books, backing papers, general correspondence, meeting arrangements, and summary reports of meetings. Inclusive dates range from 1946 through 1974.

- a. Transcripts of the meetings of the Foreign Trade Advisory Council (West Coast Group) and successor organizations, 1946-49 (part of box 52, accession no. 285-59A6) and record copies of all WITG Summary Reports. Permanent. Offer to National Archives when 10 years old.
  - b. All other records. Destroy when no longer needed or when 10 years old, whichever is sooner.
