1	<p>FLIGHT OPERATIONS RECORDS (TABLE 60-3)</p> <p>The purpose of this submission is to establish disposition criteria for flight recorder tapes removed from aircraft. When an aircraft is involved in an accident or incident resulting in an investigation, the tape is removed and forwarded to the National Transportation Safety Board. Otherwise these tapes are considered routine. They are removed from the aircraft recording equipment when filled and replaced with blank units.</p>
