Additional Schedule Information	The Alien Registration Division of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) created the Flexoline Index in 1940 to index Alien Registration records created under the Alien Registration Act of 1940. The name Flexoline, or Flex, was taken from the indexing technology employed to make the index and was referred to by that name throughout agency records. The Flex Index was microfilmed in 1955 and contains approximately 12 million names. However, the Index contains fewer than 12 million individuals, as a given individual might appear in the index under more than one name.	
	The information entered in the Flex Index varied over time and follows one of three formats depending in part on when the entry was created:	
	• Flex index entries created between 1940 and 1944 came primarily from Alien Registration Forms AR-2, AR-102, or the consular form. These entries follow a format identified by INS in automated form as "Format A."	
	• When the Alien Registration Division disbanded near the end of World War II, responsibility for the Flexoline transferred to the INS Records program. Thereafter Flexoline Index entries were created from A-Files (or trigger documents) related to new arrivals, adjustments, or other applications by registered aliens. These entries follow formats identified by INS in automated form as "Format B" and "Format C." The latter format entries date to December 31, 1954, (a few as late as December 1955 may be errors) and A-numbers as high as 8.6 million. Format B and C entries may also include lower, pre-April 1, 1944, A-numbers when that case reopened after 1944.	

	The Flexoline is not considered a complete index to A-files before after 1950. Entries prior to April 1, 1944, index registration forms only and do not indicate whether or not a physical A-file ever opened under that number. Entries after April 1, 1944, unless indexing seamen registrations, should reflect a physical A-File, bu whether every A-file was indexed in the Flex after 1944 is unknow	
	The Flexoline microfilm is arranged by Soundex of Last Name (a phonetic coding system intended to suppress spelling variations), First Name, date of birth, country of birth.	
	The Flexoline Index has been digitized and placed within the agency's MiDAS System, although there are gaps in digital image. Flexoline Index images and data will be transferred to NARA along with the rest of the MiDAS system. MiDAS is currently scheduled under N1-566-06-02.
