As a result of working in the conditions, exposure to dust, smoke, debris and the traumatic events, responders have been diagnosed with physical and mental health conditions and are eligible to apply to the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund (VCF) until October 1, 2090.

"The September 11th Victim Compensation Fund (VCF) provides compensation to individuals (or a personal representative of a deceased individual) who were present at the World Trade Center or the surrounding New York City Exposure Zone; the Pentagon crash site; and the Shanksville, Pennsylvania crash site, at some point between September 11, 2001, and May 30, 2002, and who have since been diagnosed with a 9/11-related illness." The Civil Division of the Department of Justice (DoJ) administers the VCF and processes claims for compensation. DoJ and ASPR agreed that ASPR would submit an Microsoft Excel spreadsheet with the responders that qualify to apply for the VCF based in their records. This records schedule covers the supporting records informing the spreadsheet. All other September 11, response records will follow the dispositions in the Emergency Response Activities Records, National Disaster Medical System (NDMS) Records, National Veterinary Response Team Records, Disaster Medical Information Suite (DMIS), Responder Safety and Credentialing Records, and Disaster Mortuary Operational Response Team (DMORTs) Records.

In the event that the spreadsheet is updated after the initial spreadsheet is submitted, the most current spreadsheet will follow this disposition instruction and the former spreadsheet will follow DAA-GRS-2022-0009-0002.
